- O1. The international competition is announced for string quartets. The average age of quartet members cannot exceed 25 years of age on the opening day of the competition.
- 02. The competition consists of two rounds.
- 03. Competition performances are public.
- 04. The competition repertoire

Round I a) W. A. Mozart – (quartets by W. A. Mozart dedicated to F. J. Haydn) one string quartet chosen from the following:

G major, KV 387 B major, KV 458 "The Hunt"

d minor, KV 421 (417b) A major, KV 464

E flat major, KV 428 (421b) C major, KV 465 "Dissonance"

Recommended edition: Bärenreiter

b) Leoš Janáček – 1st string guartet from the impetus of Tolstoj's

"Kreutzer Sonata" (1923)

Editor according to own choice - recommended edition: Bärenreiter

Round II a) One composition from any period according to own choice but

it must not be the same composition performed in the first round.

b) Antonín Dvořák – one string quartet chosen from the following:

E flat major, op. 51 "Slavonic" (1879)

G major, op. 106 (1895)

A flat major, op. 105 (1895)

Performance by heart is not compulsory.

05. Prizes

1st prize CZK 160,000

2nd prize CZK 110,000

3rd prize CZK 70.000

Within two weeks after the deadline participants will be informed whether their application will have been accepted.

- 07. Participants can notify possible changes in ensemble composition or repertoire by 20 August 2006.
- 08. Accommodation during the competition is provided and paid by the organizer.
- 09. Transport is arranged and paid by participants themselves.
- 10. In case of late arrival at the competition performance or breaking the rules or status of SLJ, participants will be eliminated from the competition.
- 11. The jury consists of important Czech and foreign artists and experts. Their decisions are obligatory. Results of all rounds will be made public.
- 12. In justified cases prizes do not have to be awarded or will be divided while keeping the order of gained scores of points. In the latter case, the whole amount of money for all prizes will be divided again in proportion to gained scores of points. Prizes can be divided only if completely same scores of points are gained.
- 13. The jury will decide which of the laureates will perform at the concert of winners and will assign their programme. This performance is compulsory and is a condition for gaining the award.
- 14. The organizer reserves the right to record competition performances and the concert of winners. Participants do not have a right to any payment for it. These records must not be commercially used.
- 15. The title "Laureate of Leoš Janáček International Competition", together with diplomas with their names, titles and prizes belong to all bearers. Bearers of honourable mention and other prizes and bonuses will also get diplomas without any claim to the title of laureate.
- 16. Competition will take place from 5 7 September 2006 in Concert Hall, Faculty of Music of JAMU, Brno. The closing concert and prize-giving will take place on 7 September 2006 at 7:30 p.m. in Concert Hall, Faculty of Music of JAMU, Brno.
